Thorough and efficient education thus plays a crucial role: if students acquire the basic ideas and the theoretical background, they will be equipped to exercise them not just in their personal lives but especially in their legal practice.

Due to the fact that there are no comprehensive textbooks on the topic, teaching plays very important part, given the fact that we live in a codified legal system where everyone has the tendency to look for formal or formalistic solutions in statutes only to find, to their surprise, that they are simply not there.
